



Dr. Jasper Erwin Tolarba has dual-appointment as Endowed Chair of Nursing Practice, Education, Research, and Innovation at Sacred Heart University, CT and Nuvance Health, a healthcare system composed of 7 hospitals in New York and Connecticut. Prior to this, he worked at Aya Healthcare as a Clinical Manager overseeing travel healthcare professionals in 4 states on the East Coast. He was the first foreign-educated nurse to become Director at CGFNS International (previously the Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing Schools) in its 49 years of existence. During his 5 years tenure at CGFNS International, he oversaw the credentials evaluation process and development of policies and standards related to foreign nurses migrating to the United States and Canada. He also became the Clinical Director of Nursing at Tufts Medical Center in Boston, MA and Patient Services Manager at Yale New Haven Hospital in New Haven, CT.

Dr. Tolarba was originally from the Philippines where he practiced as a nurse educator and as a licensed professional secondary school teacher (LPT) at Bicol University and the Department of Education, respectively. He migrated to the United States in 2004 where he studied a Masters degree in Nursing at Xavier University, Cincinnati on a full scholarship. After completing his MSN degree, he pursued further studies and was one of the inaugural graduates of Doctor of Nursing Practice at Yale University in 2015. He is currently completing his second Doctorate (EdD in Nursing Education) at Teachers College Columbia University in New York. He is a Sigma Theta Tau Honor Society member at Yale University (Delta Mu Chapter) and Teachers College Columbia University (Alpha Zeta Chapter).

Dr. Tolarba is a 2019-2020 Fulbright Research Scholar to the Kingdom of Jordan, Board Certified as a Global Nurse Consultant (CGNC), Certified Nurse Educator (CNE), a Fellow of the American Healthcare Executives (FACHE), and Fellow of the American Academy of Nurses (FAAN).
